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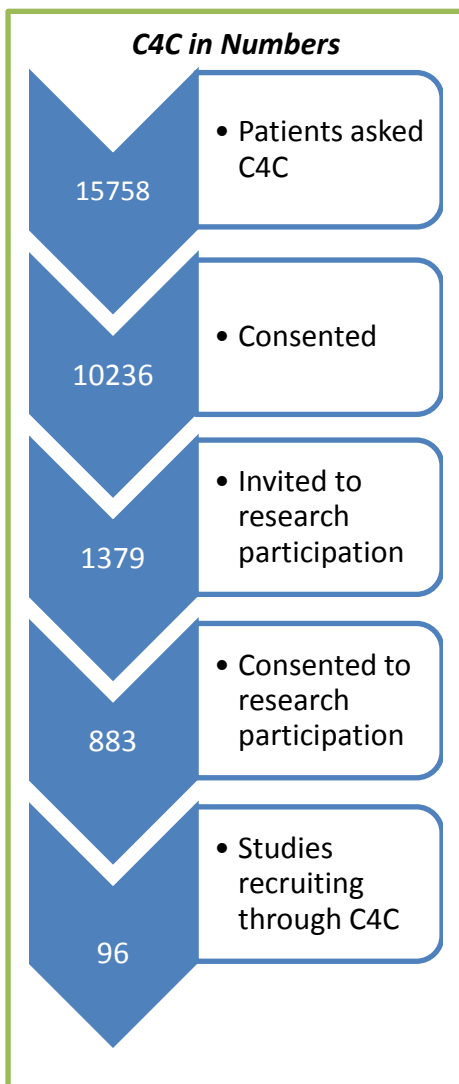
Welcome to this edition of the C4C newsletter. It has been a busy year for us and we are pleased to share with you the exciting progress we have been making.

## *C4C hits 10K*

Over 10,000 patients of South London & Maudsley (SLaM) NHS Foundation Trust have now agreed to be contacted for research. Since launching in 2012, more than 15,000 people have been asked about C4C.

To date, the number of people consenting to be contacted for research reached 10,000+ for the first time, meaning that around two thirds of people asked to date is happy to be contacted about research.

We would like to thank all staff, service users and carers for their efforts and contributions to the SLaM's research participation register.

C4C is a no obligation research participation register; service users have the choice to withdraw their consent. If you wish to do so, ask your care coordinator or doctor to remove your permission from your care records.
